The International Baccalaureate Organization aims to develop inquiring, knowledgeable and caring young people who help to create a better and more peaceful world through intercultural understanding and respect.







- 1. Parents/guardians **must copy** the Head of School and PYP Coordinator on all e-mail communication. The email addresses are below.
- We request parents to be aware of the importance school places on grooming and we request
  that you are aware of the details concerning the same mentioned in the IISB Discipline Policy
  (2.0) which is also attached along with this mail and use the weekends to plan for the same.
- Hair should be always tied back and away from the face. Hair to be secured with hairclips or hairbands, in case of short hair.
