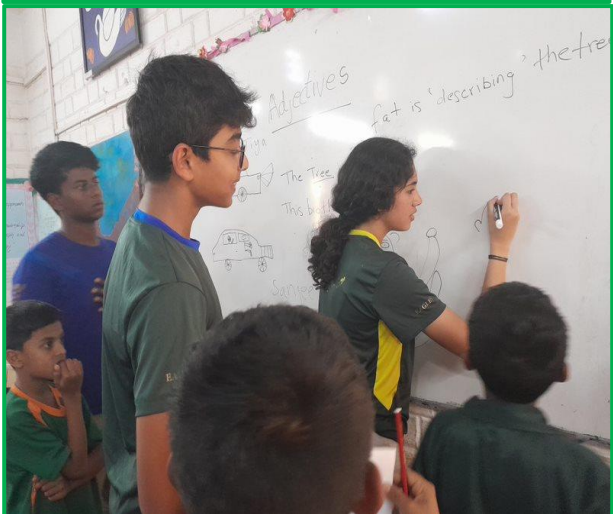
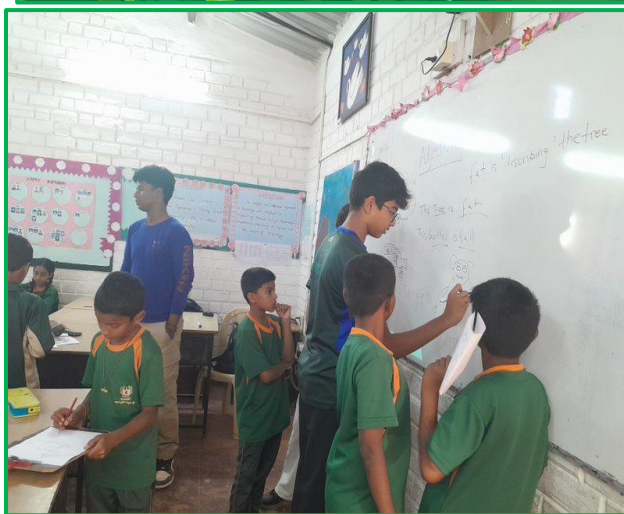

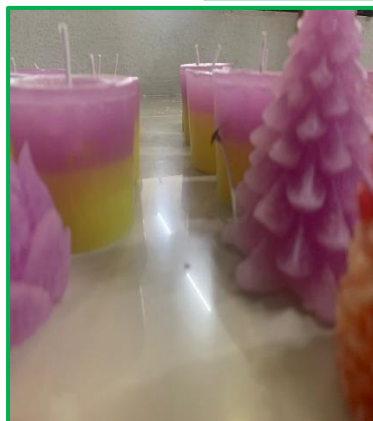




Students enjoyed fun games and movie time - Meg 2 at amphitheater with popcorn and cool drinks.
