LEADERSHIP IN ACTION

From 28 July-1 August (Batch 1) and 4-8 August (Batch 2), Grade 12 students of Indus International School Bangalore participated in an intensive program at the Indus School of Leadership. They engaged in goal-setting through obstacle challenges courses, strategic thinking in wall climbing and team navigation along with survival cooking. Paintball sessions added lessons in giving and receiving feedback, while the night rescue exercise highlighted service, empathy and guiding peers.
