### **Events:**

#### **Karnataka Rajyotsava celebration:**

A boarding student took the opportunity to explain the significance of Karnataka Rajyotsava in Kannada, shedding light on the importance of the state's formation and its cultural heritage. ### **Children's day celebration**

Children's Day at our school was celebrated with immense joy and admiration for our young learners. To make the day special, our teachers prepared a beautiful and entertaining show for the students. The program featured delightful performances, including music, dance, and a small interactive game that kept the children engaged and excited. ### **PYP Indus Day**

PYP Indus Day, held on 28th November 2025, was a vibrant celebration of the performing arts, showcasing the creativity, confidence, and collaboration of our young learners. Students from Grades 2–5 and Early Years to Grade 1 enthralled the audience through beautifully staged musical performances, invocation dances, and dramatic adaptations of well-loved literary works including *Treasure Island*, *The Blue*

*Umbrella*, and *The Rainbow Fish*. The event began with a warm welcome and the traditional lighting of the lamp, followed by inspirational addresses and the school's signature concert band performance. The day highlighted the holistic development approach of the PYP, where the arts play a vital role in expression and inquiry. It was a proud moment for teachers, parents, and the entire school community as our young performers lit up the stage with confidence and joy.

### **INSEF 2025**

At the Indian Science and Engineering fair (INSEF) Regional competition, our students showcased innovative solutions that demonstrate how technology can meaningfully improve lives. Pranay developed an AI-enabled mobile platform designed to support farmers with real-time agricultural guidance and data-driven decision-making for sustainable growth. Reyaansh introduced *NeuroFlex*, an intelligent physiotherapy and rehabilitation system that utilizes adaptive robotics to enhance recovery and physical performance.

Their exceptional work received high recognition Reyaansh earned the Gold Medal in the Computer Science category and qualified for the INSEF National Fair, while Pranay was awarded the Bronze Medal for his significant and socially impactful innovation.

These achievements reflect the Indus ethos of nurturing innovators who combine knowledge, creativity, and compassion to build a more inclusive and empowered future.



### **UPES Future Founders Challenge**

We are delighted to share that Team ReadEase — comprising Arsh Bansal, Kavish Bhandari, Parikaa Mehul Doshi, and Pranav Suri from Grade 9 — has secured a prestigious position in the Grand Finale of the UPES Future Founders National Competition 2025. Selected from over 500 entries nationwide and rising to the Top 30 teams in India, the team was also honoured with the ‘Best Research & Validation’ Award, acknowledging their strong investigative approach, thoughtful user-centric design, and commitment to creating meaningful change.

ReadEase is a portable handheld assistive device developed to support visually impaired individuals by converting printed text into instant audio output. With an in-built processor and camera system, the device operates independently of internet access — making it an accessible and affordable solution for diverse communities across the country.

The team is continuing to iterate and enhance their prototype within the Life Entrepreneurship (LE) ecosystem at Indus, benefitting from expert mentorship and an



innovation framework designed to transform student ideas into impactful real-world ventures.



## **PYP**

### **Reception**

The reception class successfully conducted their Three-Way Conference on Saturday, 15 November. Parents joined with their children during scheduled time slots, making it a warm and joyful morning. Teachers shared each child's learning journey, highlighting their emotional well-being, growing independence, and their smooth transition into the new academic year.



## Prep 1

Prep 1 students have been exploring the unit *How We Express Ourselves* through a variety of joyful, hands-on play experiences. They shared their favourite toys, discussed safe play, and discovered how different materials influence the way they play.

Children experimented with sand, clay, and water, connecting their learning to stories such as *The Three Billy Goats Gruff* and observing changes such as ice melting and freezing. Tabletop play supported integrated learning, allowing students to explore mathematical concepts like patterns, capacity, and measurement.



## **Grade 1**

On Friday, 7 November 2025, Grade 1 students attended an engaging guest session on “Sustainability and Caring for the Environment,” led by Ms Shigee Kalladithodi, MYP–DP Biology and ESS teacher.

Ms Shigee introduced simple, everyday actions that help protect the planet, such as reducing waste, saving water, recycling, and choosing eco-friendly alternatives. Students learned about inspiring “Earth Heroes,” including Jadav Payeng and young recycler Ryan Hickman. The interactive session encouraged children to reflect on their own choices and understand the impact of small actions. The Grade 1 team expressed their gratitude to Ms Shigee for an inspiring and meaningful experience.





## **MYP**

On 13th November, the Counsellors organized a joint World Kindness Day celebration for students of Grades 6–12. A combined assembly was held in the amphitheatre for both MYP and DP, where students were briefly addressed on the significance of kindness and how simple, intentional acts can create lasting positive impact in a school community. This session also included activities related to kindness.



## **DP**

November was a productive and eventful month for the IBDP community, marked by significant academic milestones and student-centered initiatives. The month began with the successful completion of the IBDP November retake examinations, ensuring that students requiring a second sitting were well supported. Registration for the May 2026 IBDP examination session was also finalized, marking an important checkpoint in the academic calendar.

Grade 12 students completed their Mock Individual Orals for second language subjects, giving them valuable practice and feedback in preparation for the final IB assessments. Alongside academic commitments, the school hosted a Wellness Program aimed at promoting students' emotional and mental well-being.

Grade 11 students took part in an Extended Essay orientation session, helping them understand expectations, research pathways, and timelines for this major IB requirement. Additionally, students from both Grades 11 and 12 participated in the MIT Aptitude Test, providing them exposure to external academic benchmarking.

## **Sports**

This month, we are thrilled to share the remarkable achievements of our students across various sports disciplines. From being selected to represent Indus International School at prestigious national events like the SGFI Nationals in Football, Chess, and Swimming, to excelling in interschool tournaments like the Alethia 2025 Football and Basketball Tournaments, our athletes have truly made us proud. Their dedication and hard work have not only earned them medals but also accolades for teamwork and sportsmanship. Further details of these outstanding performances are provided in Appendix 1.

## **Life Entrepreneurship**

### **Primary**

As part of the LE curriculum, students in Grades 1 and 2 have been engaging in a series of play-based, imagination-rich activities designed to spark creativity, storytelling, and teamwork. From inventing magical weather and creating imaginary hybrid animals to becoming ‘Animal Architects’ who design shelters for real or imaginary creatures, children are learning to think creatively and express their ideas both visually and verbally. These playful experiences help students blend imagination with early problem-solving as they draw, narrate stories, build simple models, and share their ideas with peers. Through this process, they are strengthening communication, creativity, confidence, collaboration, and their ability to bring ideas to life in an age-appropriate and meaningful way.

As part of the ongoing DTP within the LE curriculum, students in Grades 3–5 have been actively observing their surroundings, interacting with community stakeholders, and gathering insights to understand real-world challenges. They are currently working on framing clear and focused problem statements based on their interviews, observations, and ensuring that the problems they choose to address are meaningful and connected to real users. Teachers are guiding each group to refine their problem statements using evidence and user perspectives, preparing them to confidently move into the next stage of Ideation. This journey is helping students develop empathy, analytical thinking, communication, creativity, and collaboration, while giving them a practical understanding of how real-world problem-solving unfolds.

### **Junior & Senior School**

This month, students across Junior and Senior School engaged deeply in the Design Thinking Process (DTP), strengthening creativity, collaboration, empathy, and clarity of thought at every stage of their process. A key highlight was the cross-

grade ‘ideation’, where PYP students collaborated with older peers to contribute fresh and imaginative ideas to ongoing problem statements. Younger students brought playful creativity and new perspectives, while older students practiced articulating their challenges clearly using the Feynman Technique explaining a problem so simply that even an 8-year-old could understand and contribute.

This activity strengthened competencies such as communication, perspective-taking, divergent thinking, articulation, and collaborative innovation.

Across grades, students explored a range of ideation techniques including Crazy 8s, SCAMPER, Mind Mapping, ‘Yes–And’ approach and External Ideation. These tools encouraged divergent thinking, and helped teams explore multiple possibilities before identifying promising solutions.

### **Pre-Incubation Teams**

Our three Pre-Incubation teams continued strong progress this month, engaging in rigorous research, experimentation, and hands-on prototyping as they work toward meaningful real-world innovations.

Team AquaWrap is developing sustainable alternatives to plastic food wrapping. The team experimented with natural materials such as potato starch, cornflour, orange peel powder, and kombucha, analysing research papers and refining formulas through continuous testing. They are also seeking insights from subject experts and teachers to improve scientific accuracy and find optimal compositions.

Team Solix is developing interchangeable shoe outer soles, aimed at students who participate in multiple sports. Their innovation focuses on convenience, durability, and accessibility. The team continues to refine mechanisms like lock-and-slide systems, learning from previous prototypes and developing sturdier, more reliable designs. They are also evaluating whether their solution may be more suitable



for casual wear based on early durability tests.

As mentioned earlier, Team ReadEase is designing a handheld, portable assistive device that enables visually impaired individuals to access printed text through instant audio output without the need for internet connectivity.

## **Placements**

In the last week of October and throughout November, the College Counselling team hosted a series of valuable events and sessions aimed at guiding and inspiring students. On 30th October 2025, a session on Competitive and External Exams was conducted for Grade 10, providing students with crucial information on upcoming exams and strategies to manage their preparation.

On 6th November 2025, Prof. Anish Roy from Plaksha University delivered an insightful session to Grade 11 on Exploring the Potential of Generative AI through Strategic Prompting, where he discussed how AI is shaping industries and the future of innovation.





On 13th November 2025, Prof. Vishwanath from Mahindra University conducted a session for Grade 11 on Generative AI, focusing on its role in higher education.

The Subject Selection session for IBMYP and IBDP for Grade 8 students took place on 12th November 2025, helping students understand the significance of subject choices and how they impact their academic future.

### **Boarding**
